

Notice re: Audit

The Trusts, with the consent of the TAC and the FCR, has adopted a cross-trust audit program, which will be conducted by the Delaware Claims Processing Facility (“DCPF”). Each month approved unpaid claims will be randomly selected for audit. The number of claims selected for audit will be in line with prior audits. Selected claims will be put on an external audit hold. The audit will begin with the monthly sample pulled at the time releases are issued. The initial sampling for the new audit program will be based on claims included in the December release cycle.

The audit will compare the sampled claim with all other claims filed by that claimant with the following trusts: 1) The Armstrong World Industries, Inc. Asbestos Personal Injury Settlement Trust; 2) The Babcock & Wilcox Asbestos Personal Injury Trust; 3) The Celotex Asbestos PI Trust; 4) The Owens Corning/Fibreboard Asbestos Personal Injury Trust; 5) The Federal-Mogul Asbestos Personal Injury Trust; 6) The USG Asbestos Personal Injury Settlement Trust; 7) The WRG Asbestos PI Trust; 8) The Pittsburgh Corning Corporation Asbestos Personal Injury Trust; 9) The Flintkote Asbestos Trust; and 10) The Owens-Illinois Asbestos Personal Injury Trust (the “Participating Trusts”). The audit may require submission of additional information.

Claims selected for audit will be channeled into one of four audit types: 1) Medical only; 2) Exposure only; 3) Administrative only; or 4) Full audit (Medical, Exposure, and Administrative). The Medical audit will verify the authenticity of the medical documentation submitted, compare the submitted documentation across Participating Trusts, and may include the review of medical providers. The Exposure audit will include review of exposure evidence across the Participating Trusts for consistency and a determination as to whether that evidence meets the requirements of the TDP. The Administrative audit will confirm the identity and the claimant as well as verify the authenticity of the law firm. The Full audit will include elements of all three audit types. The above is a summary of the elements of the audit and is not all inclusive.

If inconsistencies are discovered during the course of the audit, the Participating Trusts may request additional information.
